

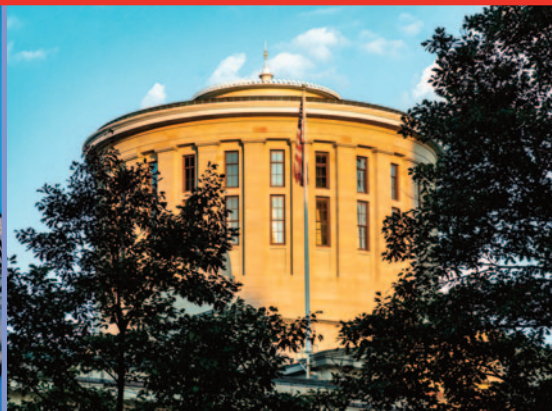

From the President

MAJ Kristina Gaskins

Greetings! We hope this edition of the Guard Post finds you and your Families happy and healthy! It has been a crazy year, and our Soldiers and Airmen have been busier than ever! From administering COVID vaccinations to warehouse operations, domestic civil disturbance missions to overseas air defense, our Service members are being called to Active Duty more now than ever before. In the coming years, over 50% of our force will be deployed in support of domestic and contingency operations. They prove again and again that we are no longer a strategic reserve, we are an operational force that can respond and complete our missions on par and above our Active Duty counterparts.

The ONGA felt the effects of the previous two years. We are in dire need of new and lifetime memberships to continue to provide a voice in the Capital for our hardworking members. The importance of membership in the ONGA cannot be overstated – now more than ever our numbers and concerns to be heard in order to ensure we continue to provide the services and benefits our members so definitely deserve.

Currently, NGAUS is diligently fighting to pass five Army National Guard priorities, five Air National Guard priorities, and nine joint legislative priorities. These include concurrent and proportional fielding of new equipment simultaneously with our Active Component counterparts, the continuation of funding the HMMWV modernization program at or above \$100 million, M1 Abrams and M2 Bradley Modernization and increased National Guard Military Construction Funding. They are lobbying to ensure the Space National Guard is a primary combat reserve, fully resourced and incorporated as an operational reserve of Space Force.

Most importantly, they are leading the charge to pass H.R. 3512, the Healthcare for our Troops Act. This legislation would provide zero-cost Tricare and dental to Servicemembers and their families, helping to ensure we continue to be medical ready when called. The National Guard Preventative Mental Health Program initiative seeks to provide funding for mental health programs specifically tailored to the Reserve Component and provide ready access to mental health care and suicide prevention. Tax incentives for our guardsmen and their employers and better benefits and leave policies are also top priorities. In these uncertain times, these three pieces of legislation would ensure our Soldiers and Airmen have access to the support and resources they need to stay in the fight.

WHAT WILL I DO IF I AM ON AN EVENT COMMITTEE?

- EXAMPLE: Company Grade Mixer – a social event for officers in the ranks of O1-O3 and W1-W2 to mingle, meet people, and grab drinks in a relaxed environment. Usually held in a bar/grill setting (potentially Arena District or Short North).
- Company Grade Mixer COMMITTEE (Event Team) - 2 planners that create and finalize plans for location, food, music/drinks and ticketing at the door, including interfacing with the venue staff. 5 additional officers help execute the event by ensuring the mixer goes as planned and Company Grade Officers from around the country are able to mingle and have fun for a few hours!

DO I HAVE TO VOLUNTEER FOR THE WHOLE EVENT? CAN I STILL ENJOY MYSELF DURING NGAUS? YES!

The goal is to spread the planning and execution workload around so people can enjoy themselves during most social events and downtime.

IF I WORK AN EVENT, WILL I BE ON ORDERS?

Soldiers that work on NGAUS professional development and support staff committees will be on orders to conduct official business. People assisting only with social events are not authorized to be on orders.

Membership Matters

Why Join?

When you join NGAUS, you add your voice to thousands of others who understand the role of the National Guard in other nation's security and want to enhance its capabilities to perform that vital mission at home and overseas. With your membership, NGAUS is better able to make the case in Congress for a strong, well-equipped and well-trained National Guard. NGAUS employs a team of legislative advocates that work every day in Washington on behalf of its members.

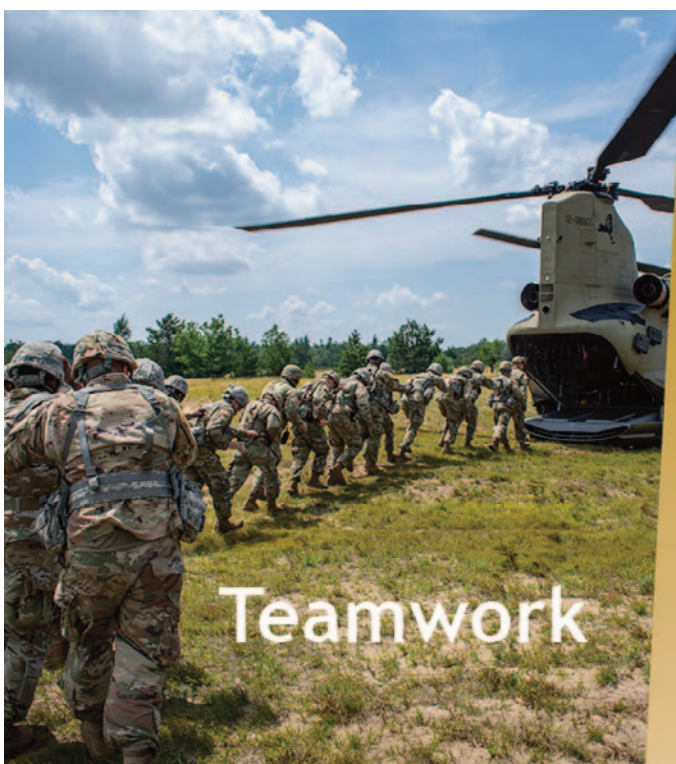
How this works: You, our members, determine the priorities or issues that impact you, your Soldiers and Airmen, and/or your unit. This could be a change in policy or regulation, address a policy or program that doesn't work, or the fielding of equipment or technology that would benefit the National Guard. These issues can originate with our state or may originate in other states who share common concerns. This problem and recommended solution can be put together as a "resolution." The Resolutions team, led by Colonel Andy Stone (Army) and Colonel Dennis Fournier (Air), work with subject matter experts to finalize the request before bringing it to the ONGA Membership for approval during the annual conference. Once approved the resolution is sent to NGAUS for review by the appropriate Task Force then delegates from each of the 54 states and territories provide recommendations to be voted on by the State delegations

during the NGAUS conference. The number of votes each state has depends on the number of NGAUS members in their state. Your membership counts!

Once the resolutions are approved, they are then prioritized for action. Each member of the NGAUS legislative team carries their own portfolio of resolutions that they track on Capitol Hill. Resolutions may fall into the category of "Army," "Air," or "Joint," but can also be assigned by functional area. For example, homeland defense, aviation, personnel and manpower, combat support, or combat systems to name a few.

The legislative team doesn't just accomplish their advocacy through their own knowledge of navigating "The Hill." They also benefit from the strength of the membership. The number of NGAUS members carries a lot of weight with our elected officials. So does state advocacy with our own state's elected officials. This may be coordinated through NGAUS or the ONGA/ONGEA Legislative Task Force.

As leaders we owe it to our Soldiers, Airmen, and Family Members to keep the National Guard well equipped, well trained and well led. We also owe it to the generations that will serve when we take off the uniform just as those before us did for us.



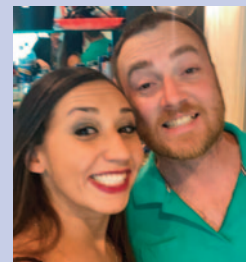

ONGA Leadership Grant

The ONGA Leadership Grant Program helps defray education costs for deserving individuals who are enrolled or plan to enroll in an institution of higher learning. Leadership grants will be awarded to active ONGA members (either officers or warrant officers) or dependents of active, life, retired, or deceased members of the Ohio National Guard Association. Leadership Grant recipients are ineligible for consideration in subsequent years. Leadership Grants for 2022 will be awarded during the Ohio National Guard Association Annual Conference at the Hyatt Regency, Columbus, OH, on February 5, 2022. The Leadership Grants are administered through the Leadership Grant Committee of the Ohio National Guard Association.

Instructions for Applicants: To complete the ONGA Leadership Grant Application, use the following checklist to complete your application packet:

- Current grade transcripts and class standing.
- A copy of your SAT/ACT scores with local and national ranking (percentile) included (undergraduate applicants only).
- A photograph suitable for publication (this can be sent electronically to ongaedcalhoun@gmail.com)
- A paper explaining why you should be selected for a grant. *Be sure to address the first five items listed below. Your paper should be a maximum of two pages in length.*
- (Optional) A single, one page recommendation from a teacher, counselor, employer, etc.

Applications will be evaluated on the following criteria:

- Grades
- Future plans
- Need
- Membership and leadership
- Honors and Awards
- Overall impression
